

- Culturally diverse campus: Students identify as 42% Hispanic, 20% African American, 14% Asian, 11% White, 6% Filipino, and 6% Multi-Ethnic.
- Average class size of 24 students.

- Experiential learning in science, technology, engineering, or mathematics (STEM) fields: Engineering and Physics students won a competition sponsored by NASA for which they produced a tool used by NASA scientists.

**TOEFL/IELTS Waiver** (ELS, Kaplan, UC Davis) Successfully complete a required intensive English program level and then enroll at CCC, DVC, or LMC.



## Admission Requirements



No SAT or ACT for admission to community college



No SAT or ACT needed to transfer to a 4-year institution

No SAT or ACT score is required for students who have sufficient credits/units to qualify as transfer applicants. This varies by institution.

- 1. Application & \$50 application fee
- 2. Evidence of Secondary / High School Graduation (if under 18)
- 3. Evidence of English language proficiency
- 4. Financial support evidence (Approximately \$26,000)
- 5. Passport

#### **High School Graduation**

#### **IGCSE/O Level**

The IGCSE and O Level qualifications described below meet both the high school graduation equivalency and English language proficiency requirements for international student admission to Contra Costa College, Diablo Valley College, and Los Medanos College.

Applicants must submit final IGCSE or O Level results showing five subjects passed with grades of C or higher. One of the subjects must be English – First Language, English as a Second Language or English Language. Scanned copies of the final IGCSE and O Level results are accepted.

Contra Costa College, Diablo Valley College, and Los Medanos College will not admit students based on preliminary results or students who take IGCSE and O Level exams as independent or private candidates.

#### **General Educational Development Test (GED)**

Applicants who pass a U.S. equivalent GED meet the high school graduation equivalency requirement for international student admission to Contra Costa College, Diablo Valley College, and Los Medanos College.

#### **Secondary (High School) Academic Records**

#### Applicants must provide one of the following:

- Study for a minimum of two (2) years at a U.S. high school with grades of C or better in academic English (not ESL)
- Final IGCSE or O level results with a grade of C or higher in one of the following: English Language, English First Language, English as a Second Language
- Graduation from a high school outside the U.S. where English is the primary language of instruction. Provide a letter from a school official on institution letterhead stating that English is the medium of instruction.
- Completed all years of upper secondary school in Sweden or Denmark with an English proficiency level of English 6 (Sweden) or English B (Denmark).

#### **Post-Secondary Academic Records**

Transcripts from U.S. post-secondary institutions showing one academic year of college level English with grades of C or higher.
